INTRODUCTION

THE ABERFELDY WEST LISTENING CAMPAIGN

The Aberfeldy West listening campaign was carried out during August 2019.

The listening campaign consulted 115 residents living in:

- Thistle House
- Heather House
- Tartan House
- Kilbrennan House
- Findhorn St
- Ettrick Street
- Balmore Close
- Jura House

The purpose of the listening campaign was to gain a snapshot of what is currently working, what improvements are needed, and priorities in relation to regeneration.

Residents were asked what they currently liked about the area, what changes they would like to see and if they supported redevelopment for the area.

- clean and quiet environment
- good transport links


Residents highlighted a number of improvements and there was a general expectation that the redevelopment of Aberfeldy would be extended to Aberfeldy West.

Nairn Street Area









